¹The association year begins after the end of the last annual meeting.

²A name shown in parentheses indicates the re-election of the officer or the selection of the person to continue in the office; if in brackets, the person continued in office for another association year because no annual meeting of the association was convened.

³The early chairpersons of the Cornitia Minora are not known.

⁴The combination of offices of Secretary and Editor provided for the initial central Office of the Association (Detroit) in January 1923. Earlier, the association records and editorial materials were kept at the home residences of Secretaries and Editors, although for many years, a Librarian was elected to keep the records.

⁵The Association established the American Veterinary Review as its house organ, first published in January 1877, and later relinquished its ownership by gift to the Editor. In October 1915, the American Veterinary Review was purchased and renamed the Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association.

⁶The listing does not include the semi-annual meetings of USVMA held between 1864 (January 19, first) and 1889

⁸The Annual Meeting dates beginning in the 1930s are different from those shown in the older AVMA Directories and the usual published announcements in order to improve their usefulness to the membership. The original dates marked the start of the Annual Meeting in terms of the day of the first full-convention business session, the day of the ceremonial 'opening' or 'plenary' session, or the first day of sectional or scientific sessions and opening of the exhibition area. These original dates do not reflect the dates of the business transactions of the Association, however. Thus, the original dates are retained in the present table, but are amended with meeting dates of the AVMA House of Delegates (successor to the AVMA House of Representatives) shown with the asterisk (first meeting August 15-16, 1934; T.E. Munice, chairperson).

CENTRAL OFFICE LOCATIONS

In its early years, the AVMA leased office space in Detroit (1923 to 1932) and Chicago (1932-1975). The Chicago office locations were 1230 Washington Boulevard (Prairie Farmer Building, 1932-1933); 221 North LaSalle Street (LaSalle-Wacker Building, 1933-1940); and 600 Michigan Avenue (Fairbanks-Morse Building, 1940-1975).

In 1970, the AVMA decided to construct its own office building. On July 6, 1973, ground was broken for a 20,000

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(March 19, last).

The expression 'designated serial No.' of the Annual Meetings is used because the Association refers to the 'Annual Meeting' in official announcements and publications. There were no annual meetings in 1874 (11th), 1914 (51st), and 1945 (82nd, executive and legislative sessions only). The 12th Annual Meeting in 1875 would have been more correctly termed the 12th anniversary meeting.

square foot building in suburban Schaumburg, Illinois, and on February 28, 1975, the Association moved into the building at 930 North Meacham Road. Despite a 1989 remodeling to expand available workspace, the AVMA outgrew its building, and in April, 1991, the Association purchased a larger, 76,000 square-foot building at 1931 North Meacham Road in Schaumburg. The Association moved into its present offices in October 1991 and is leasing the excess space in the building until it is required by the Association.
