

AVMA Political Action Committee (AVMA PAC)

Advocating for the profession is central to the AVMA's mission, and the AVMA PAC is an important advocacy tool that helps amplify our voice with members of Congress. The AVMA PAC is nonpartisan; we contribute to those in Congress who support the issues important to veterinary medicine regardless of political party affiliation. AVMA PAC support helps to elect officials to Congress who are dedicated to improving animal health and welfare, public health, and the veterinary medical profession. In accordance with adopted guidelines, the AVMA PAC contributes to the political campaigns of members of Congress who support the AVMA legislative agenda, or are in key positions where it is advantageous to the AVMA legislative agenda for them to hear and consider the AVMA's position in their decision-making process. To provide the necessary funds, the AVMA PAC solicits personal contributions from AVMA members, their immediate families, Student American Veterinary Medical Association (SAVMA) members, and select AVMA employees.

Contributing to AVMA PAC is often the first step in becoming politically active, and members who contribute to the AVMA PAC are more likely to vote in elections and get involved in political campaigns. Support for the AVMA PAC has benefited the Association and the entire veterinary profession by allowing our Government Relations Division (GRD) staff and AVMA members to build and foster important personal relationships.

The AVMA PAC Board oversees the business of the AVMA PAC and operates in accordance with Federal Election Committee rules and regulations, in addition to the AVMA PAC Policies and Procedures. The AVMA PAC Board consists of seven members—three at-large members are appointed by the AVMA Board of Directors and three regional members (East, Central, West) are appointed by the AVMA House Advisory Committee. SAVMA appoints the student liaison.

Meetings

The AVMA PAC Board conducts business via in-person meetings, virtual meetings, and electronic votes. In 2020, the PAC Board held virtual meetings throughout the year in lieu of in-person meetings because of the COVID pandemic, with long-format virtual meetings taking place on April 21 and November 16. Shorter virtual meetings took place on February 11, June 1, June 29, July 23, August 12, and December 17.

AVMA PAC Operations

The AVMA provides the AVMA PAC operational budget, which allows AVMA PAC to utilize 100% of all AVMA and SAVMA member contributions for political campaigns. Expenses for 2020 were \$117,317. Since 2017, the AVMA PAC has worked with DDC Public Affairs, a Washington, DC based organization that has over 300 PAC clients. DDC provides FEC compliance services, account reconciliation, database management, and contribution management, including processing AVMA PAC contribution checks.

Fundraising

AVMA PAC Fundraising 2020

For 2020, the AVMA PAC Board set an aggressive goal of raising \$325,000 from 2000 contributors, which were 35% and 10% higher than 2019's goals, respectively. Despite a five-month pause in fundraising activities due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the PAC raised \$271,499 from 1,901 contributors. This is a 10% increase in contributions and a 4% increase in contributors. In 2020, 100% of the Board of Directors and 77% of the PAC eligible House of Delegates members contributed to AVMA PAC.

AVMA PAC started the year at the Veterinary Leadership Conference/House of Delegates Regular Winter Session, raising \$70,428 from 220 individuals, a 28% increase from 2019. The PAC Board held a reception for all VLC attendees, including the Board of Directors and House of Delegates.

AVMA PAC paused all solicitation from mid-March to the end of July 2020. During this time, the AVMA PAC Board and staff focused on educating members on the role that AVMA PAC plays in advocating for members during the COVID-19 pandemic and directing them to useful AVMA resources. In addition to placing an informational advertisement in JAVMA, AVMA PAC hosted 10 Virtual Town Halls with Members of Congress throughout 2020. These Virtual Town Halls were open to all contributors from 2019 and 2020, in addition to all AVMA members from the guest's district or state.

AVMA PAC restarted active fundraising in August for the House of Delegates virtual session and AVMA Virtual Convention, raising a total of \$20,295 from the two events. At the 2020 AVMA Virtual Convention, AVMA PAC joined the AVMA family in the virtual exhibit hall and hosted a PAC sweepstakes. The PAC sweepstakes awards

included 6 Yeti tumblers and a grand prize of an Eko CORE Digital Stethoscope. AVMA PAC also hosted a Special Virtual Town Hall on August 24, 2020, in which the 2020 Russell Anthony ImPACt Award was awarded to Dr. Kenneth Pawlowski, and political expert Charlie Cook presented on the 2020 elections and took questions from attendees. This event was open to all 2020 PAC contributors.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2020 SAVMA Symposium at Cornell University was cancelled but AVMA PAC provided a recorded presentation for the SAVMA Chapter Delegates virtual meeting. AVMA PAC Board members also continued to visit SAVMA chapters that won the 2019 and 2020 Policy Education Grants virtually in 2020. The PAC Board approved the continuation of these grants in 2021. SAVMA chapters at AVMA accredited veterinary schools can apply for the Policy Education Grants, which are used to educate students about the importance of advocacy and contributing to AVMA PAC.

In September 2020, facing a year-to-date fundraising shortfall of over \$33,000, AVMA PAC aimed to increase contributions via two methods. The first was a large-scale direct mail campaign to over 9,000 AVMA members that had contributed to AVMA PAC since 2000, but not yet in 2020. The campaign focused on AVMA PAC's successes in aiding AVMA's advocacy efforts during COVID-19 and included a reminder to contribute via the AVMA PAC website or in the upcoming dues renewal season. An email solicitation was sent to follow up on the message.

The second method was direct outreach by AVMA PAC Board members to high-level PAC contributors (\$300 and higher), District Directors, and Delegates that had not yet contributed. This outreach, combined with the direct mail/email campaign and a record-breaking dues renewal season, saw the \$33,000 fundraising shortfall turn into a year-to-date increase of over \$24,000 by the end of 2020.

AVMA PAC Fundraising 2021

The AVMA PAC Board once again set more aggressive fundraising goals for 2021: \$375,000 from 2600 contributors. Like 2020, fundraising at virtual events proved more challenging than in-person events. At the 2021 Virtual Veterinary Leadership Conference/House of Delegates Regular Winter Session, a total of \$25,765 was raised from 36 individuals, a 63% decrease from 2020. The PAC Board held a virtual happy hour for all AVMA members present at VLC and the HOD session which included a virtual mixology class.

To make up for the shortfalls from large virtual events, AVMA PAC has shifted its focus to connecting directly with more AVMA members in leadership positions on AVMA Councils and Committees, state and allied associations, and other groups such as deans, faculty, and rising leaders. Starting in April 2021, AVMA PAC Board members began addressing and soliciting several AVMA Councils and Committees during virtual meetings.

Overall, between January 1, 2021-June 6, 2021 AVMA PAC raised \$79,322 from 458 contributors compared to \$99,430 and 498 during the same period in 2020. AVMA PAC hosted two virtual Congressional Town Halls through June 2021, including Congressman Sanford Bishop (D-GA) and Congressman Jim Hagedorn (R-MN). AVMA PAC also unveiled a wholesale redesign of its website in March 2021. In addition to a simplified contribution page, the website includes several features to make the PAC's leadership and operations more transparent. These features include an interactive map showing candidates supported by AVMA PAC by state, more information on PAC Board members and contribution criteria, and access to AVMA PAC newsletters.

The PAC Board plans to carry over several fundraising initiatives from 2020 into 2021. The first is the Back the PAC Alumni Derby competition, which was originally scheduled to run from the beginning of the 2019 VLC through the 2020 Veterinary Leadership Conference. The end date was extended to the end of the 2021 AVMA Convention. Contributions during this period are counted towards the alumni participation rate for the contributor's veterinary school. At the end of the contest, the top 3 schools will be awarded grants to their SAVMA Chapters in the amounts of \$3,000, \$2,000, and \$1000 respectively.

The second initiative is the AVMA PAC Diplomat Program, which is designed for AVMA and SAVMA members who are willing to educate and solicit their peers on behalf of AVMA PAC. Participants receive a Diplomat Guide which provides the necessary tools and information they will need to conduct an effective campaign, including keys to success, best practices, and frequently asked questions. The Diplomat program launched at the 2020 Veterinary Leadership Conference, with 10 members initially signing up for the program. The Diplomat Guide was updated in early in 2021 with information pertaining to COVID-19 recovery legislation and new guidance for virtual events.

AVMA PAC is scheduled to attend the 2021 Southwestern Veterinary Symposium, the 2021 American Association of Bovine Practitioners Annual Meeting, and other in-person events in 2021. AVMA PAC is planning on participating in both the 2021 House of Delegates Summer Session in Chicago and the 2021 AVMA Virtual Convention and will hold a special AVMA PAC virtual event during convention week. The PAC will also expand upon its fall direct mail and email campaign to reach a larger number of AVMA members.

AVMA PAC Contributions to Qualified Candidates

The AVMA PAC uses the following criteria in evaluating distributions:

- Is the incumbent/candidate or his/her family member a veterinarian?
- Is the incumbent/candidate a pro-science and pro-veterinary medicine legislator?
- Does the incumbent/candidate represent a district/state with veterinary schools?
- Does the incumbent/candidate represent a district/state with a significant number of AVMA members, and does the incumbent/candidate have a strong relationship with AVMA members?
- Does the incumbent sit on key Congressional committees which consider legislation important to AVMA and support AVMA positions?

AVMA PAC guidelines:

- AVMA PAC supports congressional members who are veterinarians or have a veterinarian in their family.
- AVMA PAC supports incumbents who serve in leadership positions or are on key congressional committees that consider legislation important to AVMA and who are supportive of AVMA policies and positions.
- AVMA PAC supports incumbents who understand veterinary concerns and are supportive of AVMA positions.
- AVMA PAC's priority is to Members of Congress who serve in leadership or who sit on committees of jurisdiction, such as the: House and Senate Agriculture Committees; House Energy and Commerce Committee; Senate HELP committee; House Small Business Committee; and Senate Small Business and Entrepreneurship Committee.
- AVMA PAC will not generally contribute to a Leadership PAC. In special circumstances, Leadership PACs will be considered.
- AVMA PAC will not generally contribute to a Senate race out of cycle. In special circumstances, such races will be considered.
- AVMA PAC will not generally contribute to the retirement of campaign debt. In special circumstances, debt retirement will be considered.
- AVMA PAC will comply with the letter and spirit of all federal and state laws.

116th Congressional Cycle Contributions (2019-2020)

From 1/1/2019-11/3/2020, AVMA PAC made 341 contributions totaling \$484,000, including contributions to veterinarian Reps. Kurt Schrader(D-OR), Ted Yoho (R-FL) and Ralph Abraham (R-LA). Reps. Yoho and Abraham announced their retirement at the end of the 116th Congress.

Total Expenditures by Party

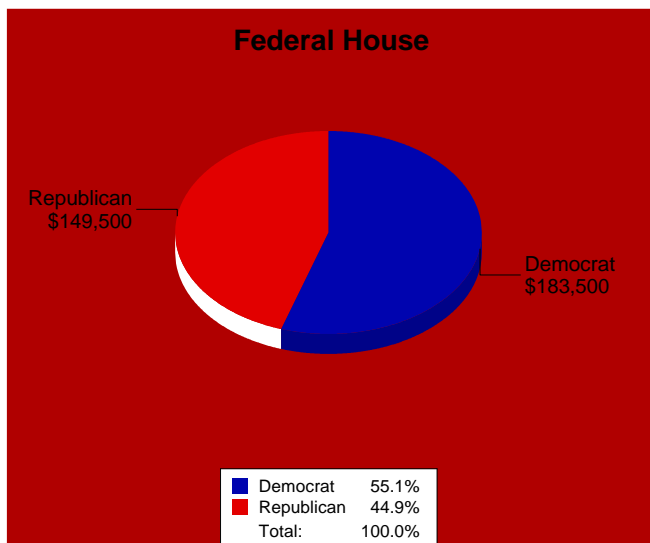
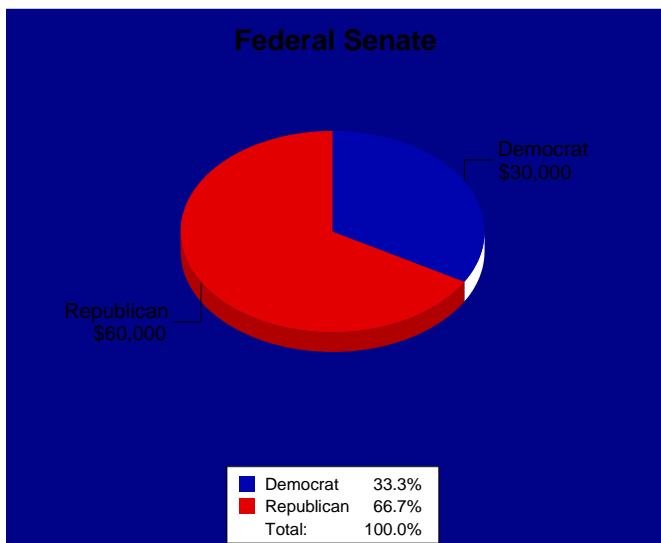
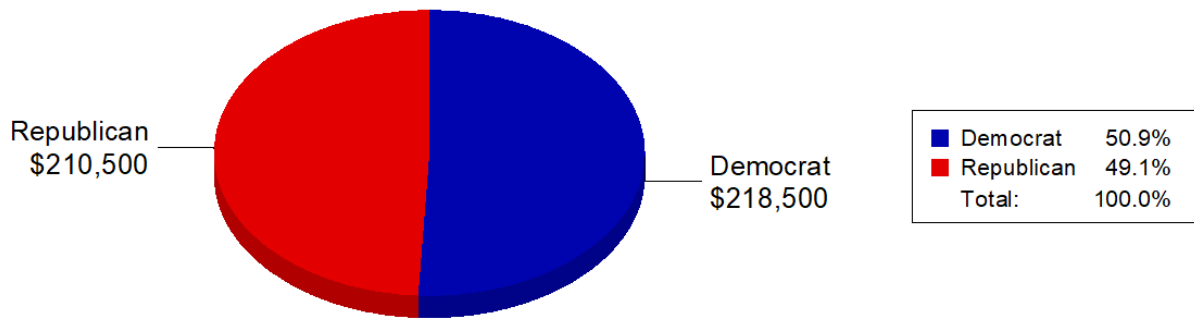


Chart 1. AVMA PAC Contributions by Party, (1/1/2019-12/31/2020)

AVMA PAC is nonpartisan. The AVMA PAC Board strives to keep an even distribution of PAC funds to each political party. Independents counted as part of the party that they caucus with. The majority party is usually a

few percentage points higher because they hold the chairs of the committees, and the committees have more majority members than minority members.

117th Congressional Cycle Contributions (2021-2022)

AVMA PAC, with consent from the PAC Board and AVMA Board of Directors, began making contributions to candidates for the 2022 Election Cycle in March 2021. As of June 5, 2021, AVMA PAC has made 16 contributions totaling \$62,000. This includes contributions to the co-chairs of the Veterinary Medicine Caucus, Rep. Kurt Schrader(D-OR) and Rep. Dusty Johnson(R-SD).

AVMA Ambassador Program

The AVMA Ambassador Program was launched in January 2018 and is intended to protect and promote veterinary medicine by leveraging AVMA PAC to use local voices to amplify AVMA's legislative priorities with targeted members of Congress.

Working closely with state and allied veterinary medical associations as well as AVMA leadership, a reliable cadre of effective veterinary leaders, communicators and advocates are identified. Ambassadors attend political events or have one-on-one meetings with key lawmakers while they are in their respective states and/or districts. While meeting with their lawmakers, Ambassadors advocate for the profession by advancing AVMA's legislative agenda. They also nurture relationships with lawmakers and their staff. AVMA's goal is for the Ambassadors to become reliable "go to" experts for their members of Congress on matters related to veterinary medicine, animal health and welfare. In 2020, 69 Ambassadors completed 74 events with 69 legislators and 2 candidates across 34 states. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, engagement by AVMA member veterinarians with elected officials shifted to virtual engagements (one-on-one, small group events, and tele-town halls) from March 2020 onwards. Clinic tours and in-person events resumed in May 2021.
