SUBJECT: S.2215, the Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program Enhancement Act

Recently, Senator Crapo (R-ID) approached your boss, a progressive senator from Massachusetts, and asked her to cosponsor S.2215, the Veterinary Medicine Loan Repayment Program Enhancement Act. The senator you work for sits on the Senate Armed Services Committee and Finance Committee. As the junior senator from Massachusetts with little background in agriculture, and as a skeptic of large-scale factory farming, she would like to learn more about the issue before she decides on a position on the legislation.

This legislation would exclude VMLRP awards from gross income, thus ending the federal taxation of these awards. Because the VMLRP is currently paying the withholding for the tax on behalf of recipients, ending the tax would allow more VMLRP funds to be used for awards and increase the number of veterinarians that could participate in the program.

Please write a brief memo of no more than 500 words summarizing the legislation and its possible impact. Point out any benefits or problems with the legislation, the impact on and repercussions the legislation would have on our constituents and congressional district, supporters and opposition, and recommend whether your boss should cosponsor it or not.

Your boss will have to make her decision soon, so you must work quickly with the time and resources that you can gather between now and then to ensure that she has the information she needs to make an informed decision on whether to cosponsor the legislation or not.

Please do not contact any member of Congress or their staff regarding this exercise. It is a theoretical scenario created solely for the purpose of evaluating AVMA GRD externship applicants.
