REVISED POLICY ON APPROVAL AND AVAILABILITY OF ANTIMICROBIALS FOR USE IN FOOD-PRODUCING ANIMALS

RESOLVED that the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) House of Delegates adopt the revised policy on Approval and Availability of Antimicrobials for Use in Food-Producing Animals as noted in the <u>attachment</u>.

Statement about the Resolution

The Council on Antimicrobials (CoA) recommends the following revisions:

- 1. Third Paragraph -
 - The first sentence has been removed because the veterinary feed directive (VFD) order for feed and water-soluble medically important antimicrobials is in effect.
 - The second sentence has been revised to encompass medically important injectable antimicrobials.
 - The last sentence was added to protect individual veterinarian's prescribing ability as groups call for increasing restrictions on veterinary use of antimicrobials.
- 2. The fifth paragraph was deleted, but similar concepts are included in a new concluding sentence in the fourth paragraph. The language was changed to emphasize the importance of stakeholder engagement as that seems to be limited/absent in some recent draft guidance documents issued by Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and it also stresses the importance of focusing on risk-based, rather than precautionary, policy making.
