

Notice of accreditation actions by the AVMA Council on Education December 2018

The AVMA Council on Education (COE) is recognized by the United States Department of Education as the accrediting agency for colleges and schools of veterinary medicine in the US. In keeping with the regulations of the United States Department of Education, the following are the accreditation actions taken by the AVMA COE.

The Council took the following actions during its December 20, 2018 meeting.

Accredited is a classification granted to a college that has no deficiencies in any of the Standards and is granted for a period of up to seven years. A college with one or more minor deficiencies that have minimal or no effect on student learning or safety, that can be reasonably be addressed in one year, are Accredited with minor deficiencies. Colleges with a status of Accredited submit annual interim reports to monitor continued compliance with the Standards of Accreditation. Colleges with a status of Accredited with minor deficiencies submit reports twice a year.

Based on a review of reports submitted, the COE granted accreditation status as follows:

- **Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico Facultad de Medicina Veterinaria y Zootecnia – Accredited**

- **Lincoln Memorial University College of Veterinary Medicine – Accredited**
