Commercial products and homemade concoctions might resolve the odor, but they have no power against the rabies virus. Skunks, raccoons, bats and foxes account for the majority of rabies cases in the U.S., and can pose a significant risk to you, your family and your pets. Even indoor pets are at risk.

## RABIES KILLS, BUT IT CAN BE PREVENTED:

- Vaccinate dogs, cats, ferrets, and select horses and livestock against rabies
- Don't let your pet roam free, where they may come into contact with rabid wildlife
- Bat-proof your home and other structures on your property
- Don't leave exposed garbage or pet food outside, as it may attract wild or stray animals
- Don't keep wild animals as pets
- Keep your distance from wildlife and stray animals...even the cute ones
