Skunks, raccoons, bats and foxes account for the majority of rabies cases in the U.S., and can pose a significant risk to you, your family and your pets. Even indoor pets are at risk.**

**RABIES KILLS, BUT IT CAN BE PREVENTED:**

- Vaccinate dogs, cats, ferrets, and select horses and livestock against rabies
- Don't let your pet roam free, where they may come into contact with rabid wildlife
- Bat-proof your home and other structures on your property
- Don't leave exposed garbage or pet food outside, as it may attract wild or stray animals
- Don't keep wild animals as pets
- Keep your distance from wildlife and stray animals...even the cute ones
