# One Health Project 2012-2013

- **16 SUBMISSIONS FOR START-UP FUNDING REQUESTS  
(\$700 x 14 = \$9,800)**
  - **TWO SCHOOLS NEVER RECEIVED THEIR FUNDING DUE TO ADMINISTRATIVE ERRORS**
- **4 SUBMISSIONS GRANT APPLICATIONS WERE SELECTED  
(\$1000 x 3 = \$3000)**
  - **KANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY, THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY,  
UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA**
  - **AN ADDITIONAL COMPETITIVE GRANT WAS RETURNED TO SAVMA  
BECAUSE THE CHECK ARRIVED TOO LATE FOR EVENT PLANNING  
AND EXECUTION**
- **CURRENT TOTAL = \$12,800**
- **RECEIVED ALMOST ALL EVENT REPORTS FROM ALL SCHOOLS**

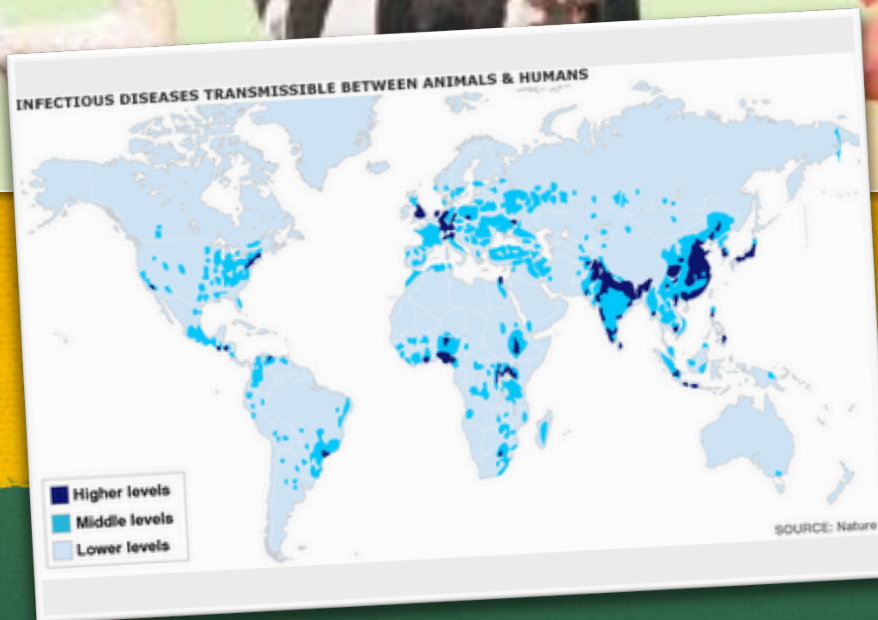

What diseases can fleas transmit?

**TICKS**

**BORNE HUMAN DISEASE**

**TICKS**  
(IXODES SCAPULARIS)  
COMMON DISEASES:  
1. Lyme Disease  
2. Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever  
3. Tularemia  
4. Babesiosis  
TREATMENT:  
- Penicillins reduce tick with bursters in one upward feed, do not make or seek.  
- If you remove it in a plastic bag for testing PREVENTION:  
- Use repellents, wear clothing and boots, or cover up.  
- Use regular tick checks, ticks, mites, scabies.

**MOSQUITOS**  
PREVENTION:  
- Wear repellents, wear protective clothing, mosquito nets + screens, get rid of standing water.

**MITES**  
(Several human species)  
COMMON DISEASES:  
1. Scabies  
2. House dust mite allergies  
3. Chigger bites  
- very itchy at night  
- can cause scalp and hair loss for several days.  
TREATMENT:  
- Wash all clothes and bedding  
- Wash house thoroughly  
- Permethrin + Ivermectin

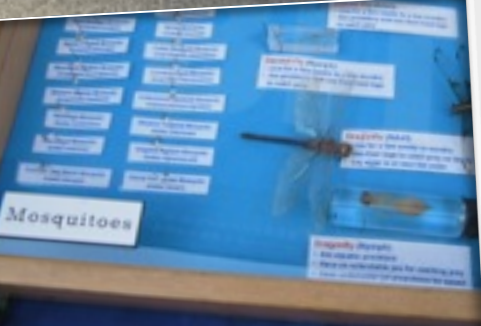


